What used to be a dilapidated building has been transformed into a charming tasting room and restaurant. Stunning views of both the modern Dornier winery and surrounding mountains and vineyards can be enjoyed from the wide veranda. Service was extremely friendly, welcoming, attentive and flexible. How thoughtful to offer the bottle price when the two of us ended up ordering 4 glasses of wine and offering to provide bread rather than the requested spoon in order to soak up the delicious sauce which accompanied the pan fried squid.
